The Statue of Our Lady of the Holy Rosary of Fatima, a gift to St. Francis Xavier Church from the Portugese Consul in New Orleans and his wife, Mr. and Mrs. Louis C. Carvalho, was carved in Portugal, at the site of Our Lady's apparitions. It is an exact replica of the statue now in the Basilica in Fatima. Having been carried in a solemn procession of about 10,000 persons to the Basilica, it was blessed by his excellency Most Reverend Senhor Dom José Alves Correia da Silva, Bishop of Leiria, on August 13, 1947. Another procession of about 10,000 accompanied the statue on September 8th when it left Portugal for its destination in New Orleans.

The statue is carved from Brazilian cedar wood painted in delicate colors. Embedded in the wood there are 120 jewels. The crown is solid silver surmounted by twelve solid gold stars set with semi-precious stones. The fifteen decade rosary in the hands is solid gold. Supporting the statue is a reliquary containing some soil, a piece of stone, and some leaves of the tree where the apparitions took place. The reliquary itself is over 250 years old, and was given to Mr. Carvalho by the Archbishop of Braga, Portugal.

During the months of December 1947, January and February 1948 the statue was exposed, (with full approval of His Excellency Most Reverend Joseph Francis Rummel, Archbishop of New Orleans) in various churches and institutions of the Archdiocese. After February 29th the statue will be kept permanently in a special shrine in St. Francis Xavier Church, 448 Metairie Road. It being the first statue "Blessed at Fatima" to remain permanently in the United States.
